of the circle and cheers erupted! **Marc** amazed us with his robust energy. **Peryl**

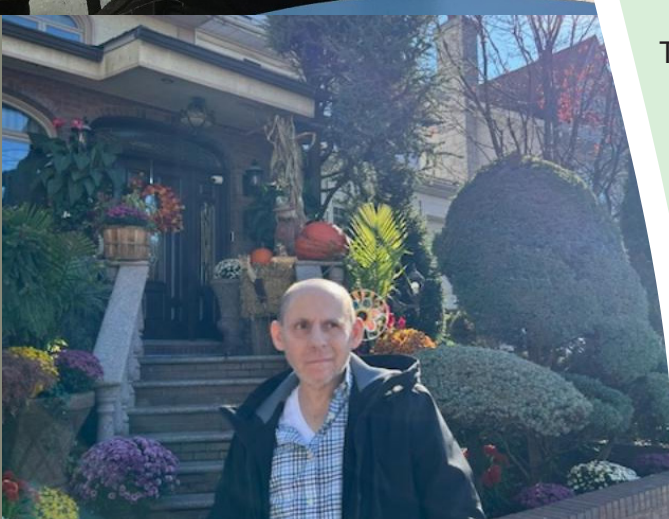
