Sukkos Decorations..

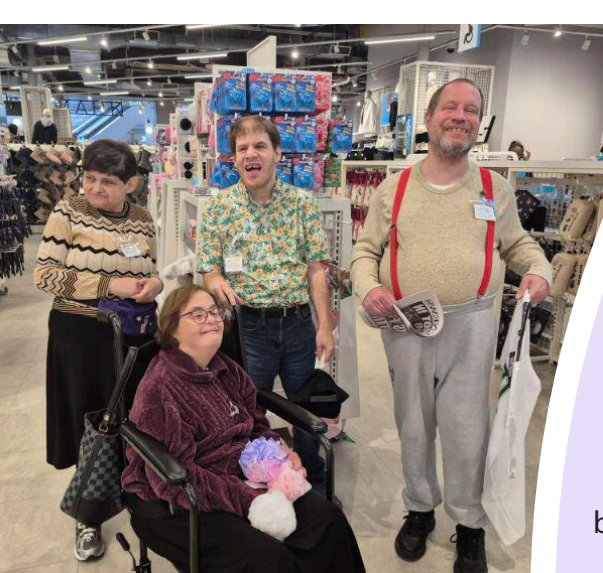
