Now that he has come into contact with the Kohen, a great change might occur in this man's life. This plan of Hashem's was used when King Hizkiah neglected the duty of marrying and begetting children. In order to bring Yeshaya the prophet to rebuke the king, the king fell ill and Yeshaya visited Hizkiah. The king's illness was intentionally sent for the purpose of the meeting with the prophet. A person who became ill and while in the hospital met a Torah scholar is an example of this idea.
